STANDARD RANGE RULES



These Standard Range Rules are for the safe running of the Range and associated Range property.

Powers of the Range Officer concerning conduct on the Range are absolute and not subject to question or discussion, other than by the Range Operator or Range Representative.

- 1. Minors.** For the safety of all minors between the ages of 11 and 18 years old they must be at all times under the direct and immediate supervision of a parent, grandparent, guardian or another person who is acting in the place of the parent. The parent, grandparent or guardian or the person acting in the place of the parent is to be licensed to possess the firearm to be used.
- 2. Language.** Offensive language will not be tolerated on the firing line or in the club rooms while the range is operating.
- 3. Unlicensed Individuals.** Any person who wishes to try the sport of target shooting and is unlicensed must be under the direct supervision of the Range Officer or the Range Officer's appointee.
- 4. Clothing.** Every person on the range must wear appropriate clothing. Shooters are to wear as a minimum:
 - Fully enclosed shoes – no thongs, sandals, or partially enclosed shoes e.g. Crocs.
 - A shirt/top that covers the upper torso e.g. T-shirt, 'Polo' shirt, no singlets.
 - No more than one piece (or 50%) of camouflage clothing on the upper body or legs. Serving military personal or Police on duty who are using the range are exempt.
 - No clothing or items that may cause alarm can be worn e.g. military 'Flak' jackets, military styled webbing, or combat vests etc.
- 5. Bayonets.** All detachable Bayonets must be removed from any firearm before it arrives on the firing line. Those firearms with a permanently fitted Bayonet at the point of manufacture must have the Bayonet secured in a closed position at all times whilst on the range property.
- 6. Drones / Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs).** Drones/UAVs are not to be flown on any Ranges unless authorised by the Branch / Club Range Representative for specifically planned survey or media purposes.
- 7. Cameras / Videos.** Cameras/Videos are not to be used on any SSAA Queensland Ranges unless authorised by the Branch / Club Range Representative for specific approved purposes.
- 8. Domestic Animals.** Due to safety concerns, no domestic animals are allowed on the range property unless written permission is obtained from the property owner and property lessee.
